Research paper evaluation criteria

- Creativity trying some creative ways
- Complexity/Difficulty trying to achieve something more complex/difficult.
- Completeness
- Quality of writing:
 - Clarity
 - Comprehensive writing, good use of figures and tables.
 - Typos and grammar mistakes.
 - Scientifically correct
 - Science discussion of your results.
 - What do the results mean?
 - Are the results consistent with the expectation?
 - How do your results compare with previous studies in the literatures?
