
















Station North Works: A Full Service Garage

Ten artists serve Artscape attendees during the festival while transforming the parking garage across from the Charles Theater into an environment of inquiry. For example, look to buy fake food in the nearby food court, or notice signs on lamp posts that ask burning questions such as "So, what is it like being you?"; a phone number will let you call your answers in. Anywhere in the festival you might also take a survey from someone wearing a Services United t-shirt and receive a free service such as a pat on the back, or if you prefer you may be walked to the nearest water station or toilet.
